MEDICAL MISSION TO ECUADOR A HUGE SUCCESS—THANK YOU!

Families travelled many hours to the Hospital Leon Becerra in Guayaquil and waited in long lines to have their child seen by the orthopedic medical team. The team screened 149 children and treated sixty-three patients for significant congenital orthopedic impairments. The surgeons on the trip included Dr. Douglas Avella, Dr. Brian Shaw, and Dr. Edward Nieuwenhuis. "This is work that desperately needs to be done and we are able to do it. It is practicing medicine in its purest form," said Dr. Shaw.



The surgeons were assisted by anesthesiologists, nurses, a pediatrician and laypersons. "Being part of this mission was a chance to partake in the making of miracles. Every member of our team worked tirelessly and was delighted to see many children depart with the ability to lead more normal and productive lives," said Rosemarie Gelber, the Trip Administrator.

Healing the Children NJ sent a team of doctors to Arequipa, Peru in April to provide reconstructive surgeries on children with cleft lip and cleft palate. The team led by Dr. Lloyd Gayle, a plastic surgeon from NYC and Dr. Lee Eisenberg, an ENT surgeon from New Jersey performed fifty-five procedures on twenty-two children. "We came together as a group of medical professionals on our trip to Arequipa with one goal in mind—provide the children of Peru an opportunity to receive surgical care not readily available in their own country. Our goal was accomplished by helping twenty-two children during our time at Hospital Infantil-TMR," said Dr. Jeffrey Bienstock, the team pediatrician.





The children travelled from local provinces to receive life-changing medical care and a chance for a brighter future. HTCNJ has been to the Hospital Infantil Tony Molleapaza Rojas twice since 2014, and plans on sending a plastic and reconstructive team and ophthalmology team to the same facility in April 2018.

A. Making a difference




HTCNJ WELCOMES AYDIN

During her stay in the United States Kathleen was hosted by the Oplinger family, a volunteer host family that has been affiliated with the International Inbound Program for over a decade.

Q. How are you doing since your scoliosis surgery ten months ago?

A. I feel good, both physically and psychologically. Before the surgery I was sad because of my limitations, but now I am very happy to have a straighter back with no complications. While I am still recovering, I am more

active and look forward to swimming again soon. I am thankful to Healing the Children New Jersey for changing my life.

Q. Do you have a special memory with your Host Family?

A. The truth is that I could never forget the Oplinger family and what they did for me. My parents are grateful to them as well. I really enjoyed attending Matt's college football games on the weekends. I did not know anything about American football before coming to the US, and now I love to watch games on television.

Q. How has your experience with Healing the Children New Jersey's International Inbound Program affected your life?

A. Thanks to Healing the children New Jersey I was able to have my back corrected by excellent doctors. Although the operation was difficult, I now feel stronger and more confident. This experience taught me the meaning of kindness and generosity. I promised myself that one day I would help other children in need of care.

Q. What are your goals for the future?

A. My short-term goal is to graduate college with a degree in psychology. One day I would like to work in the United States and travel all over the world, learning about different cultures, and making new friends. Right now I have to be positive, believe in God, and have faith that my dreams can come true.
